After referral: Intake, risk assessment, CD assessment, staffing.

Eligibility: Who gets into Wellness Court?

Take the discretion out of the equation:

Anyone we have jurisdiction over who is high risk and high need is eligible for our program.

What is high risk high need?

High risk of recidivism

High Need is a clinical diagnosis, that is obtained through a screening tool.

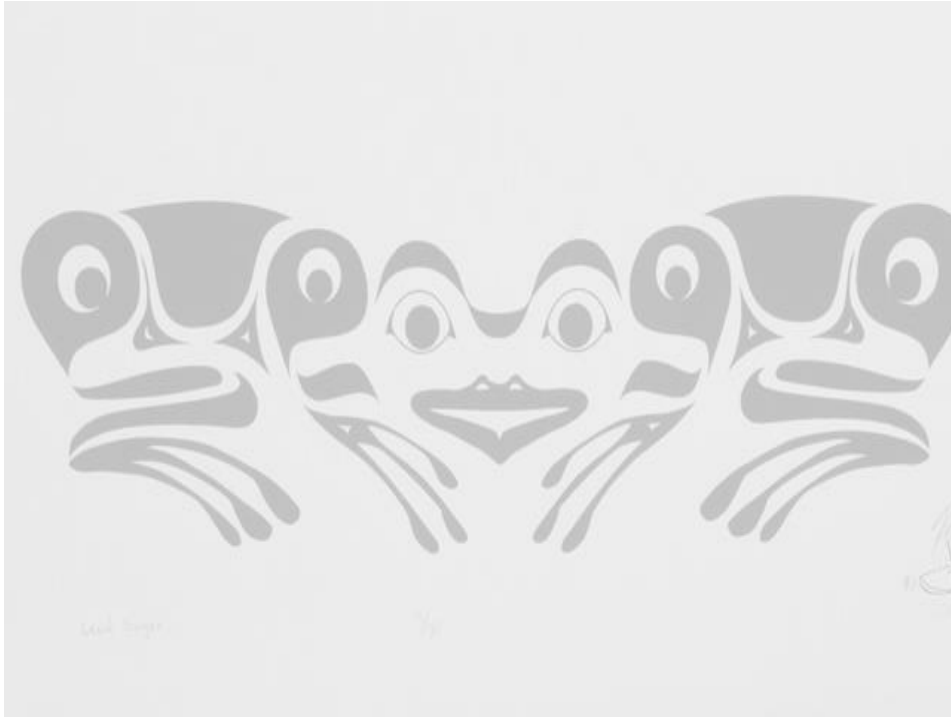

- One on one meeting with case manager:
 - Personal Information
 - Address, children, living situation
- Chemical Dependency History
- Mental Health History
- Medical History
- Legal History
- Education Information
- Transportation issues



After a person enters the program what happens to their underlying criminal case?

We have two tracts for entry into the program.

- Pre-trial
Essentially a deferral where case is not resolved while they are in the program.
Give up trial rights if they are terminated from program.
- Probation violation.
Probation is akin to taking over their probation supervision.

Either tract the case is transferred into Wellness Court and becomes a Wellness Case (even their case number changes)

- the Wellness program.
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Provisional Phase

- First 3 hearings are provisional phase (can enter paperwork during this time).
 - Participant must OPT OUT during provisional phase otherwise they are entered into Wellness!
 - If they FTA during this phase, they are automatically entered into the Wellness program.
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Once a person is entered into Wellness Court what do they do?

- Participant Agreement
- Treatment
 - Inpatient
 - Outpatient
 - Women's Group
 - MRT
 - Self-help
 - MAT
- Case Management and Individual Case Plans
 - Adapt as needed
- Weekly goals



Program Stages
and requirements:

5 STAGES



Stage 1 – Intro to Wellness

- Curfew 9pm-6am
- GPS
- Treatment plan
- UAs – at least three per week
- Weekly visit with case manager
- Doctor's appointment scheduled
- Dental appointment scheduled
- Address housing barriers
- Cultural activity
- 3 SS meetings per week (in-person)
- Attend Wellness Court
- No missed UAs for 14 days
- Plan to pay back restitution

Stage 2 – Accountability



- Curfew 10pm-6am
 - Maintain sober housing
 - Treatment compliance
 - UAs – at least three per week
 - Weekly visit with case manager
 - Copy of High School Diploma/GED
 - OR identify education/employment goals
 - Attend MRT, complete steps 1-4
 - Begin working on Recovery Plan
 - Attend dental & medical appointments
 - Cultural activity
 - 3 SS meetings per week (in-person)
 - Attend Wellness Court

- 90 days minimum
 - At least 30 days of negative UAs
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Stage 3 – Life Skills

- Maintain sober housing
 - Treatment compliance
 - UAs – at least two per week
 - Weekly visit with case manager
 - Continue working education or job goals
 - Complete MRT
 - Continue working on Recovery Plan
 - Cultural activity
 - 3 SS meetings per week (in-person)
 - Attend Wellness Court
-
- 90 days minimum
 - At least 45 days of negative UAs



Stage 4 - Independence

- Maintain sober housing
- Treatment compliance
- UAs – at least two per week
- Every other weekly visit with case manager
- Obtain and maintain employment (20 hrs/wk) or enroll in and attend school (10 credit/qtr)
- Establish sober network
- Participate in Alumni Group
- Continue working on Recovery Plan
- Cultural activity
- 3 SS meetings per week (in-person)
- Attend Wellness Court every other week
- Complete 40 community give back hours

- 90 days minimum
 - At least 60 days of negative UAs

Stage 5 - Mastery



- Maintain sober housing
 - Treatment compliance
 - UAs – at least two per week
 - Monthly visit with case manager
 - Obtain and maintain employment (20 hrs/wk) or enroll in and attend school (10 credit/qtr)
 - Maintain sober network
 - Participate in Alumni Group
 - Cultural activity
 - 3 SS meetings per week (in-person)
 - Attend Wellness Court monthly
 - Pay off restitution
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- 120 days minimum
 - At least 120 days of negative UAs

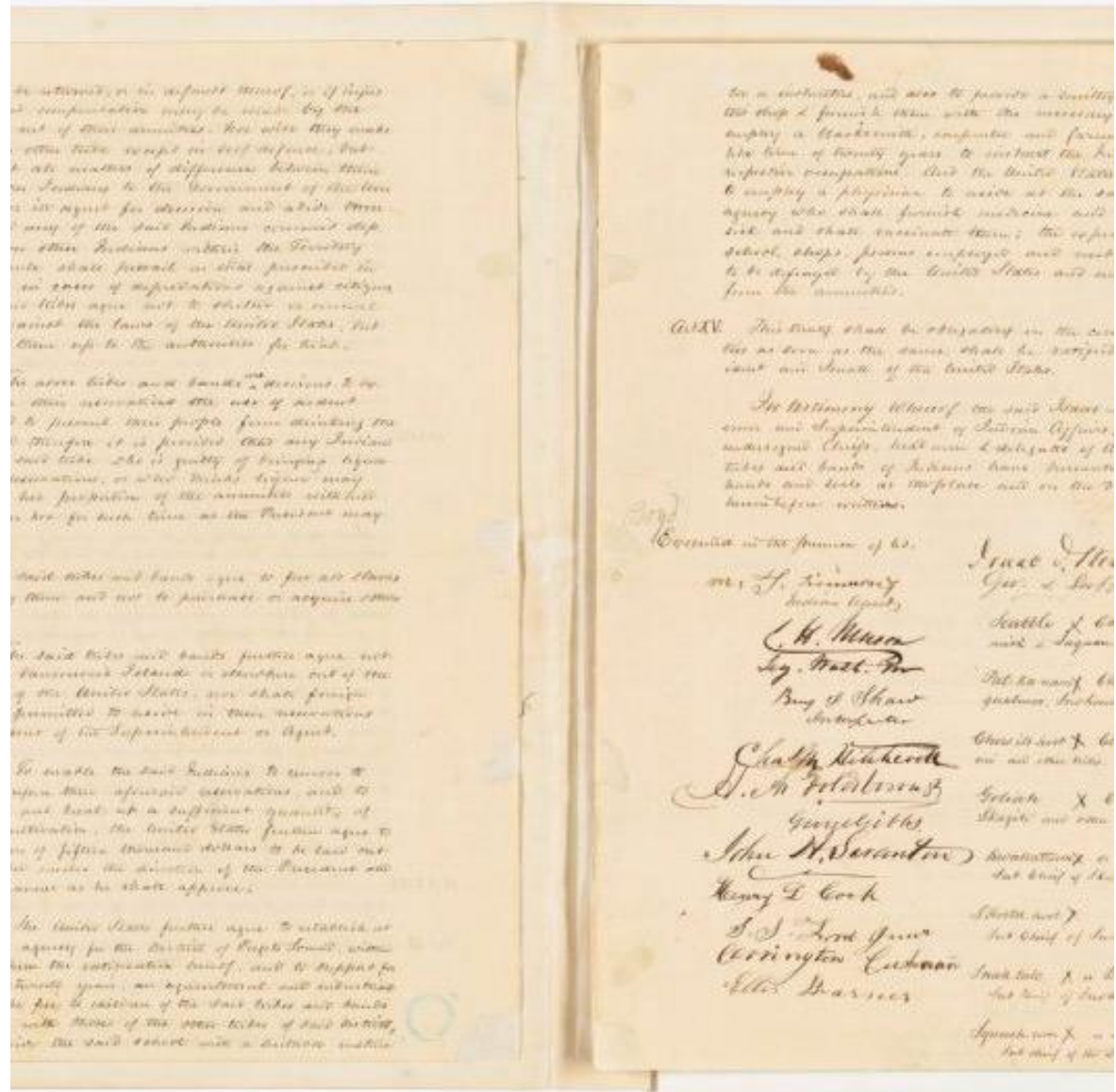

Trip Requests & Treaty Rights

- Trip Requests:
 - 48 prior to travel
 - Team reviews request
 - Must be: stages 2-5 and 100% compliant for 3 consecutive weeks
- Treaty Rights:
 - Stage 3 and up
 - UA day before and day after
 - Photo w/ GPS during activity



Successful Completion

What happens to their underlying case when they successfully complete the program?

- PT cases are dismissed or probation is closed
- Probation cases may be expunged (vacated)
- Alumni Group
- Commencement Ceremony



Termination



- What happens if they don't successfully complete the program and are terminated?
 - Notice of termination is issued by prosecutor
 - If participant wants to contest, hearing outside of WC is scheduled
 - If terminated, participant is sentenced.
 - Both parties get to make recommendation on sentencing
 - Why would someone get terminated?
Automatic termination:
 - Drug sales
 - Violent crime
 - Threats to WC participants or team
 - Permanent DV/SA protection order issued against them
 - Discretionary termination:
 - Lack of progress in treatment
 - New criminal charge (not existing unresolved charges)
 - repeated failure to complete requirements
 - Tampering with drug testing
